

KNOX LAKE – Knox County, (481 acres), motors over 10 hp must operate at idle speed only and no wake.

Black crappie – small population, 6-10", reproduction inconsistent, use minnows and jigs around brushy cover. OUTLOOK – GOOD.

Bluegill – fair population, 6-8". Submerged roadbeds fished during the spawning season are most productive, although shoreline cover is good throughout year. OUTLOOK – GOOD.

Channel catfish – good population, fish up to 10 pounds. In summer of 2005 a 39" catfish was caught. Best catches are made by bottom fishing at night with shrimp, nightcrawlers, or cut bait. Note: bag limit of 6, only one 28" and greater. OUTLOOK – EXCELLENT.

Largemouth bass – very strong population, dominated by 13-18" fish. Woody shoreline cover and vegetated areas are productive. NOTE: 18" minimum length limit. OUTLOOK – EXCELLENT.
