

O'SHAUGHNESSY RESERVOIR – Delaware County, (912 acres), unlimited horsepower

Bluegill – good population, 6-7". Anglers fishing shoreline cover throughout lake with maggots or nightcrawlers are successful. OUTLOOK – GOOD.

Crappie – good population, 8-12". Fishing cover along deeper shorelines with minnows or jig and minnow is best in early spring. Move to shallower water as water warms. Good lake for crappies in 2007 and 2008. OUTLOOK – GOOD.

Largemouth bass – good population, 12-18". Lake is one of top 10 lakes in state for tournament fishing. Brush, stumps and fallen trees along both banks are productive. 12" minimum length limit. OUTLOOK – EXCELLENT.

Saugeye – fair population, 12-26". Due to large watershed, lake is prone to flooding. Saugeye, a highly migratory fish species, are prone to washing through dams during flooding so population levels and fishing success vary widely from year-to-year. Try the tailwater after high water events. Twister type baits are popular. OUTLOOK – VARIABLE.
