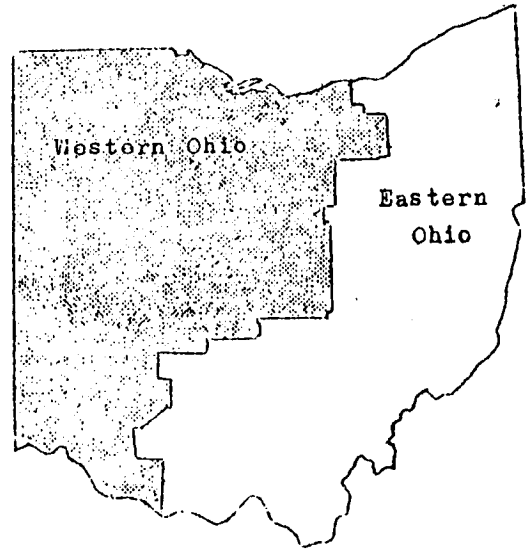

This is the first quarterly release issued under the cooperation of the above three agencies. The purpose is to provide producers and buyers with current timber prices for primary forest products marketed in Ohio. The prices were collected by the District Farm Foresters of the Ohio Department of Natural Resources. Reported prices are those prices paid directly to producers during August 1960 and not necessarily those prices paid by the ultimate users of the timber. The prices in the tables are based on the Doyle Log Scale since all reports were made on this basis. The average price for all grades is the price provided by buyers and in his judgement is the average price paid for all timber of the specified species.

Because of the differences in the prices paid for sawtimber stumpage in eastern and western Ohio, prices are reported separately for these two areas as shown on the map.

In general, prices are higher for stumpage marketed in western Ohio than for that marketed in eastern Ohio.
