### Largemouth Bass **OUTLOOK: FAIR**

Low numbers of 10-16" fish, with an occasional fish up to 20 inches. Although bass numbers are low compared to other lakes, some quality fish are present. A 7+ pound fish was taken in June 2007.

### Bluegill Sunfish **OUTLOOK: GOOD**

Good numbers of bluegills in the 5-7 inch range. Try fishing red worms or wax worms under a bobber along weed bed edges.

### Channel Catfish **OUTLOOK: FAIR**

Nearly 10,000 channel catfish yearlings have been stocked since 2000. Summertime night fishing is productive for catfish. Bottom fish using live baits such as chicken livers, night crawlers, shrimp, or cut shad.

### Rainbow Trout **OUTLOOK: EXCELLENT**

The Division stocks 2,400 catchable trout (9-13 inches) each spring during early to mid-March. Adams Lake has good shoreline access, making it a great place to take youngsters. Productive lures include small spinners (e.g. Mepps, Rooster Tail, or Panther Martin) and small jigs with plastic twister tails. Also try wax worms, red worms, kernel corn, and prepared baits (e.g. Power Bait or Gulp) below a bobber.
